This year's donations to benefit patients with cancer, those managing chronic health conditions

Camden, N.J., Jul 27, 2022 - As part of the <u>Subaru Loves to Care program</u>, representatives from Subaru of America, Inc. (Subaru) visited Cooper University Health Care recently to announce a number of donations to benefits Camdenbased patients being treated at Cooper.

Subaru presented a check for \$30,000 to purchase durable medical equipment – including blood pressure cuffs, glucometers, and scales – to help patients manage chronic health conditions at home and help prevent the need for emergency department visits or hospitalizations. In conjunction with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS), Subaru also donated a supply of plush blankets and handwritten messages of hope for patients with cancer at MD Anderson Cancer Center at Cooper. Subaru also announced a \$15,000 donation to the LLS to support a transportation fund for Camden patients undergoing cancer treatment.
