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## Subaru Of America, Inc. Reports Best Monthly Sales Since "Cash For Clunkers"

- Automaker up 17 percent

Cherry Hill, N.J., Mar 31, 2011 - Subaru of America, Inc. (SOA) today announced its second best sales month ever, with 26,916 vehicles sold in March 2011. Sales increased 17 percent, helping the automaker achieve its best first quarter retail sales ever.

The Subaru Legacy sedan set an all-time sales record in March, up nearly 28 percent from 2010. Impreza also increased, led by WRX/STI sales, which more than doubled compared to the previous year. Outback experienced its best sales month ever with nearly 40 percent growth.
